Additional control doesn't always mean adding on wires. Before you take a dip, take control. The Jandy Wireless AquaLink RS can control your pool's entire equipment pad from right inside your home. This unit can be used for any AquaLink RS OneTouch or All Button Control System; it's easy to retrofit into any existing pool. The unit has a range of 300 feet, and doesn't require line of sight operation. It uses a 2.4-GHz radio-frequency signal with two-way communication.

You want to watch the action as it happens? Set up a live surveillance system in minutes with WebView. All you need is a PC and an Internet connection. Monitor up to four wireless XCom2 cameras from almost any location; each one can update images every four seconds. You can check in from the Web by accessing multiview.x10.com and entering a registration code and password. The kit starts at \$169.99; MultiView users can upgrade for \$79.99.

Did you ever think you'd see the day when we'd be paying for radio? XM provides 100 channels of music, news, sports and entertainment—and many of them are commercial-free. No more lost signals and fuzzy stations. Wherever you go, XM will be there. And the same unit that plays the stations in your car can be transported and integrated into your stereo system. Sony's home unit (shown above) runs for \$299, with other accessories also available. The service is \$9.95 per month.

**CDR-HD1000
Yamaha Corp.**

So many fun features in one box. The CDR-HD1000 (\$999) is a combined CD recorder and hard-disk drive (HDD). It has a 20GB hard-disk capacity, meaning you can load data equal to 30 audio CDs right on the hard drive without having to compress a thing. No compression means it maintains that CD-quality sound. It accepts digital signals sampled at 96 kHz, 46 kHz, 44.1 kHz or 32 kHz; it also has analog inputs and 24-A/D converters for analog sources.

**DTV1080
Zenith Electronics Corp.**

This set-top receiver (\$799.95) is designed to show you what the HDTV hype is all about. It receives all ATSC digital TV formats, both DirecTV HD and standard signals, and outputs them at outstanding quality to multiple rooms. The box includes Dolby Digital 5.1 processing for six-channel surround sound, and built-in aspect ratio correction that switches between widescreen and conventional formats. It also includes a universal remote with thumb-stick operation.
